Members of the Kiwanis Club of Glendora Kiwaniannes presented a \$2,000 check to the City of Hope, Division of Pediatrics, during a recent visit and tour of the facility.

The donation will go toward the Pediatric Transportation Program that provides a transportation service for many children undergoing cancer treatments at the hospital, especially those children from low-income families who rely on public transportation.

The funds are raised by the club through a recycling program of collecting used ink cartridges called "Cash For Trash." The project is an ongoing fundraiser whose proceeds directly benefit children who are hospitalized, said club project chair Barbara Latasa.

"The club would like to thank the Latasa family, Barbara, Carlo, and their daughter Theresa for their dedicated efforts in this ongoing fund raising project that benefits hospitalized children," said Club president Tina Novodoczky. The Latasas, owners of the Glendora Employment Agency, have coordinated the recycling project for the club since its inception in 2000, raising a total of \$7,500 in gift donations from the club for various hospitals.
