**Past President of the Glendora Kiwanianes Rita Scott passed away Aug. 16.** Rita was a Charter member of the Glendora Kiwanianes and held the position of President in 2001-2002. She was also Div. 35 Chair for Distinguished Kiwanian in 2006-2007. She received the 'Kiwanianne of the Year' (voted by club members) in 1999.

She had been in a coma for 16 days. She had COPD, and a brain infection on the left side of her brain.

Services were held Sunday, Aug 25 at Cornerstone Church in Glendora, with a reception at the LaFetra Senior Center. In lieu of flowers, the family asks that any donations be made in her name to the Eye-DAS foundation.

She is survived by only son, Ray, 4 grandchildren and their spouses, 4 great grandsons, sister Cecile and her husband, 1 niece, 2 nephews, cousin and his wife. She also leaves behind many many friends who love her and will miss her.

**Field of Valor Nov 10 to 17, 2013** (from LTG Brad Manning)

**Dear Superheroes, it is that time again that we can show our support for our military through the Field of Valor in Covina. Please make sure that your new President gets this information since the planning is taking place now but it will not be run until their term in office (Oct 1, 2013 to Sept 30, 2014).**

**Please talk to your club members about how they can help and support this wonderful program.**

1. Clubs and members can sponsor flags in honor or memory of someone in the military, past and present. The cost is \$35.00.
2. We will have a Kiwanis Booth that will give out info about our organization but more importantly we will collect items that the public is donating to the troops. This booth will run each day of the event from Sunday, Nov. 10 to Sunday Nov. 17. It will be open from 2pm to 9pm each night. Anything collected during the day, I will collect at night and bring to my home for storage. Some of these items we will use for our March Division 35 Military Box Project and some will be given to the USO for distribution.
3. We need help setting rebar stakes into the ground on Friday, Nov. 8<sup>th</sup>. We won't begin this until about noon (the time will be determined as we get closer to the event) but it should take no more than an hour once we get started if we get plenty of help. For those that helped last year, we have a new template that will make it much easier to drive the stakes straight.
4. We have a Parade of Flags on the morning of Saturday, Nov 9<sup>th</sup>, where we will march along Grand Ave to the school and place all 2000 flags on the stakes. This does take time because it is done very ceremoniously but it is very impressive. I believe we will begin at 9am and we should be out by noon.
5. We need volunteers to help with security from 9pm to midnight. We'd like 3-4 people there each night. Robert Davis and I did this 5 or 6 nights last year but we could use some help this year.
6. There will be another Interclub Luncheon on Thursday, Nov 14 with In-N-Out there again. We'd like to get as many there as possible for this event. We had 7 clubs there last year so let's do even better this year.
7. Lastly, we will need help with clean up taking the flags from the stakes to the truck and then removing the stakes, then unloading the flags from the truck about a mile away at the storage area. This again will take some time but the work isn't too hard.

**Please talk your club about helping.** I know everyone can't do everything, but hopefully everyone can do 1 or 2 of these. The more help the better.
