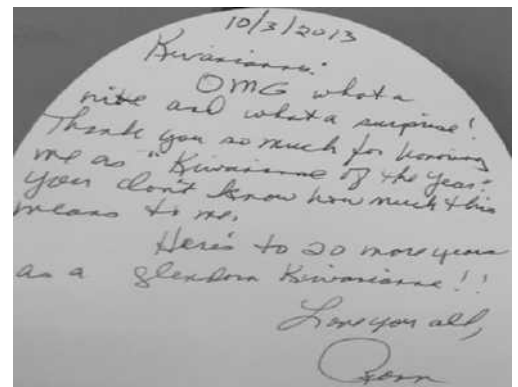

The Music Matters campaign funded by the Duarte Education Foundation is providing the funding for instrumental and choral instruction for all students K-6 in the Duarte schools.

The Duarte Kiwanis Club was honored with a prestigious award at a recent Division 35 Installation Luncheon for incoming Lt. Governor, Robert Davis. Outgoing Lt. Governor Brad Manning presented the Duarte Club with the honor of being named Club of the Year. Brad commented that he had the opportunity to see the Duarte Club in action within their community and internationally. Reyna Diaz, long time club member, was instrumental in helping bring Banda El Salvador, the High School Marching Band for all of El Salvador, to Southern California so they could march in the Rose Parade.

This was quite a wonderful event including Duarte Club Members, Sierra Madre Rotary Club members and even a Lions Club member from Rosemead! The club also recognized three of its own members for DSA's – Treasurer Filippo Fanara, Secretary Kathy May and Board Member, Karen Herrera. Since Karen wasn't able to attend the installation dinner, her DSA was presented at the City Council Meeting when the club was recognized for the Division 35 Club of the Year award.
