


El Monte Kiwanis Club President Paul Bunnell, of the El Monte Police Department, is asking for the assistance of the Division in the investigation involving the unusual disappearance of the Kiwanis Club of Monrovia's bell at the last DCM.

President Paul says, "How could a trained, retired police detective and current City Manager (an observant and truly trained professional) and manager of the entire city budget and city business lose or misplace a small bronze bell?? It's beyond me. I believe it is even broken and not very well maintained. Gene Hartigan may be the best lead. Please refer any information to the Monrovia club. In the best interest of the division and my club I will personally be conducting a separate investigation. The service will be free of charge however I would expect to be compensated for any information leading to the recovery or finding the bell. In any condition. Rumors have been spreading about shavings and metal clippings seen at the last DCM? That could have been a threat of what could happen if (\$\$) there wasn't any reward money offered. I would also think their Prez would actively seek out info or at least start with some formal inquires?"

"My investigation is due to my club members being insulted and comments made about "body cavity searches." Something else was said about a mortician being involved? 
