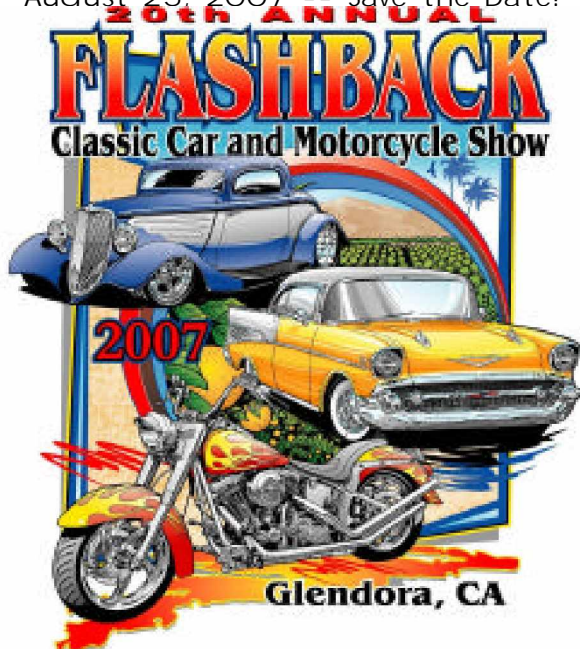
Ongoing Projects of the Glendora Kiwanians
