The Kiwanis Club of Duarte has changed its meeting times to 12 noon on the first and third Tuesday of each month. The location is the same.

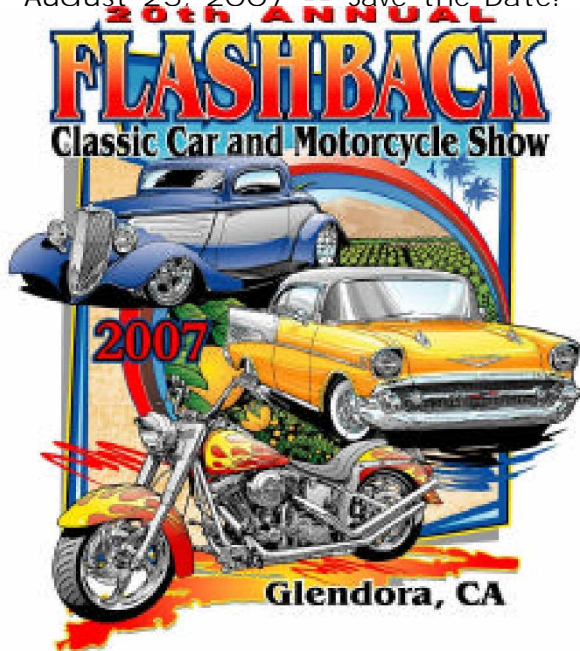
