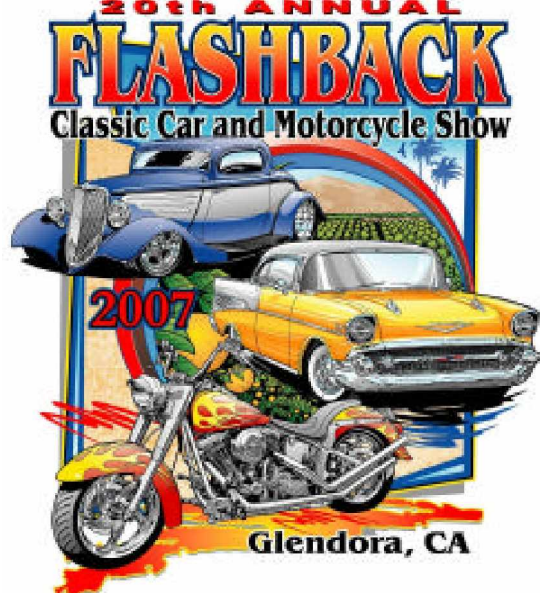

Pediatric Trauma Our Major Focus

The Kiwanis Cal - Nev - Ha Foundation, recognizing the serious need for education and training in the areas of pediatric trauma and injury prevention, established the Pediatric Trauma Program (PTP) in 1994. Our mission is to develop local projects, which will reduce the number of children in our district who are killed or injured by accidents. Utilizing the knowledge and expertise of our partner hospitals, the Foundation identifies projects the Kiwanis family can undertake to address the issue of Pediatric Trauma within their own communities. The Foundation's partnership with children's hospitals in Oakland, San Diego, Loma Linda, Madera, Honolulu and Reno connect the Kiwanis family to the issue of Pediatric Trauma.

The Kiwanis Cal-Nev-Ha Foundation works closely with our partner hospitals to provide funding to train pediatric doctors, nurses and first responders, to purchase much - needed pediatric medical equipment and to create or expand community outreach programs.

All of this is only possible due to the generous support of our clubs and members. Donations earmarked for PTP are spent in three major areas: grants to our partner hospitals; grants to Kiwanis and SOAP clubs; and PTP safety items which are available for purchase by the Kiwanis family at a subsidized cost.

Today, the Pediatric Trauma Program continues to enhance our current Foundation programs with new areas for community service and involvement.

Proposed Amendments 1. Next Generation Kiwanis. PASSED
 To allow Kiwanis the flexibility to create and test new forms of membership and new ways to participate in Kiwanis service, consistent with the Objects of Kiwanis, on a limited basis. This will be reviewed yearly and voted upon again in five years.

Proposed Resolution. Collaboration among Kiwanis, Rotary, Lions, and Optimists. PASSED

Comments and Reporting on the 2007 KI Convention

If you missed the convention, you missed a real good time and outstanding exciting leadership. About the best Convention ever. It rivaled the one last year in Montreal. Siemens and Tucker are great together.

There were the usual elections as follows: Dave Curry was elected International President for 2007-2008. Donald R. "Don" Canaday was elected President-Elect to follow the next year. Both of them seem to be very good people and shows promise of continuing the new ideas in Kiwanis. Paul Palazzolo was elected to be the Vice-President for next year and will automatically move up in the chairs.

There were 3 elected International Trustees from Region I (U.S.): Bascom L. Allen Sr., Randolph "Randy" Delay, and Bernard Wayne "Bernie" Knott.

A **Resolution** was passed that Kiwanis International supports exploring collaboration with Rotary International, Lions Clubs International and Optimist International on ways to serve the needs of children.

Amendment 1 Proposed: To allow Kiwanis the flexibility to create and test new forms of membership and new ways to participate in Kiwanis service, consistent with the Objects of Kiwanis, on a limited basis... **Passed**

Amendment 2 Purpose: To move the duties of the "chief executive officer" in charge of day-to-day operations from the International President to the Executive Director, and change the title of "Executive Director" to "Chief Executive Officer," with the position remaining under the supervision and director of the International President and the Board of Trustees. **Passed**

Amendment 3 Proposed: To eliminate the requirement for the International Council to meet annually while still allowing it to meet if needed... **Passed**

Amendment 6 Proposed: to change the deadline for submission of proposed amendments and resolutions to February 15 to allow more time for consideration and review... **Passed**

Amendment 7 Proposed: To change references in the International Bylaws form "magazine" and "Kiwaniis magazine" to "official publication.".... **Passed**

Amendment 8 Proposed: To restore Kiwanis magazine to a balanced budget without a fee increase.... **Passed**

Amendment 14 Proposed: To provide what vote is necessary to add new provisions (Article or Sections) to the International Bylaws, requiring a 2/3 vote.... **Passed**
